The 23 students of the Class of 2018 applied to **117**, were accepted to **86**, and will matriculate to **20** different public and private universities and colleges in the **US, Canada and Asia**.

Our students received **merit based scholarships** to both public and private colleges and universities at which they will matriculate.

The average award was \$18,153. The four-year total of this aid is **\$1,234,400**!

For the past five years, our students' average award was \$16,210 per year. Each year, between 52% and 74% of the graduating class receives merit awards.

The class of 2018 had the highest average award per student, and the most students receiving awards of the last 5 years!

The strength and breadth of our curriculum shows in the fields of study our students choose. The class of 2018 has chosen majors that reflect both their broad interests, and the artistic bent of many in this diverse class. **57%** have chosen majors in the Arts or Humanities, **30%** plan to focus on Math or Science, and **13%** will study Business or Management. With interests from Architecture to Zoology, they are **confident learners** who know what they want from the next four years.

Our Seniors are Engaged with the World, and ready for College and Work

During the spring of their junior year, the class of 2018 took part in **internships** in businesses, non-profits and the arts, statewide and beyond. Students use these experiences to explore their interests and make practical use of the skills and knowledge base they have gained. Their interests are diverse, and 26% chose internships in the sciences, 13% in business, 48% in the arts, and 13% in the social sciences.

Thanks to our stellar language programs, over 20% of our class went on an exchange program, and in turn hosted a student from around the world. Beyond the personal growth that comes with such an immersive experience, our entire school benefits through these partnered exchanges. Our seniors and the rest of the student body have the chance to get to know these students, and discover common ground and cultural differences.



The class of 2018 was very involved and highly successful in **Sports**. Fourteen seniors - **61%** of the class - competed in sports during their high school careers. They competed in Soccer, Basketball, Volleyball, Tennis, Golf and Cross Country. Over their 4 years of athletic participation, the school won **9 conference championships** and **2 district championships**. Three students in the class of 2018 were named to all-conference teams, and two students received honorable mentions.

The senior year is highlighted by two trips and the senior play. In the fall the class studied tide-pool zoology for a week in Hermit Island, Maine. During April, the class spent two weeks in Italy studying the history, art, and architecture of Rome, Venice and Florence. Finally, the year was capped off by the performance of the senior play, *The Tempest*.
