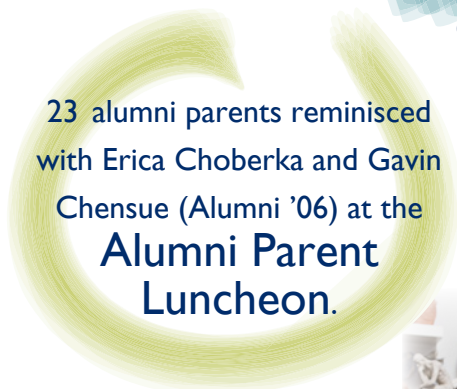

for the first time!



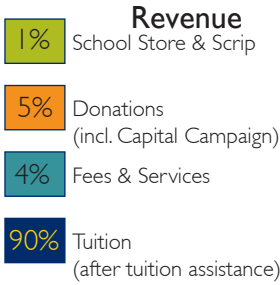
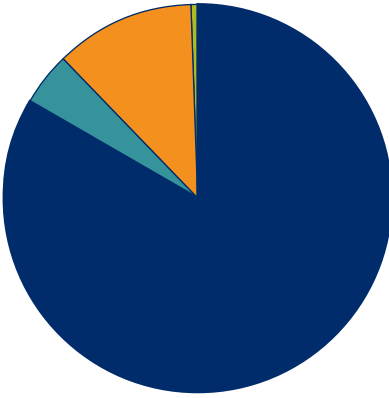
