The 32 students of the Class of 2019 were accepted to **71** and will matriculate to **29** different public and private universities and colleges in the **US, Canada and Europe.**

Our students received **merit based scholarships** to both public and private colleges and universities at which they will matriculate.

The 2019 average award is \$22,681

The four-year total of this aid is **\$1,270,128!**

For the past five years, our students' average award was \$18,204 per year. Each year, between 44% and 74% of the graduating class receives merit awards.

The **strength and breadth of our curriculum** shows in the fields of study our students choose. The class of 2019 has chosen majors that reflect their broad scope of interests. **38%** have chosen majors in the Arts or Humanities, **38%** plan to focus on Math or Science, and **25%** will study Business, Communications or International Relations. Whether they are pursuing dance or chemical engineering, interior design or biology, they are **confident learners** who know what they want from the next four years.

Our Seniors are **Engaged with the World**, and ready for **College and Work**

During the spring of their junior year, the class of 2019 took part in a wide range of **internships** in businesses, non-profits and the arts. Students use these experiences to explore their interests and make practical use of the skills and knowledge base they have gained.

Thanks to our stellar international programs, over 34% of our class had an **international experience**. 19% of our class were international students and many local students went on an **exchange program**, and in turn hosted students from around the world. Beyond the personal growth that comes with such an immersive experience, our entire school benefits through these partnered exchanges. Our seniors and the rest of the student body have the chance to get to know these students, and discover common ground and cultural differences.



The class of 2019 was very involved and highly successful in **Sports**. **78%** of the class competed in at least one sport during their high school careers. They competed in soccer, basketball, volleyball, cross country and rowing. Over their 4 years of athletic participation, the school won **3 conference championships** and **2 district championships**.

The senior year is highlighted by two trips and the senior play. In the fall, the class studied tide-pool zoology for a week in **Hermit Island, Maine**. During April, the class spent two weeks in Italy studying the history, art, and architecture of **Rome, Venice** and **Florence**. Finally, the year was capped off by the senior performance of Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*.
