Our Graduates are **Engaged with the World** and ready for College and Work

During the spring of their junior year, our students take part in a wide range of **internships** in businesses, non-profits and the arts. They use these experiences to explore their interests and make practical use of the skills and knowledge base they have gained at our school. Many go on to directly apply this knowledge in future jobs, gap-year experiences or college studies.

Thanks to our **stellar international programs**, a large portion of our students have unique cultural and language-learning experiences. International students living in Ann Arbor exclusively to attend our school help enliven our community. Many of our local students participate in our robust **exchange program**, visiting a variety of countries and in turn hosting students from around the world. Beyond the personal growth that comes with such an immersive experience, our entire school benefits through these partnered exchanges. Our student body has the chance to get to know these students, discover common ground, explore cultural differences and build lifelong friendships.

The senior year is highlighted by spring and fall trips, a **senior project** and the senior play. In the fall, the class studies tide-pool zoology in **Hermit Island, Maine**. Mid-year, the students embark on an in-depth project, diving deep into a technical, scientific, business or creative topic they are interested in. During April, the class spends two weeks in Italy studying the history, art, and architecture of **Rome, Venice** and **Florence**. Finally, the year is capped off by the senior performance of a **Shakespeare play**.

Our students are very involved and highly successful in **Sports**. Around 65% of our students compete in sports and have carried the Steiner Storm teams to multiple district and conference championships.



# Ready for The World

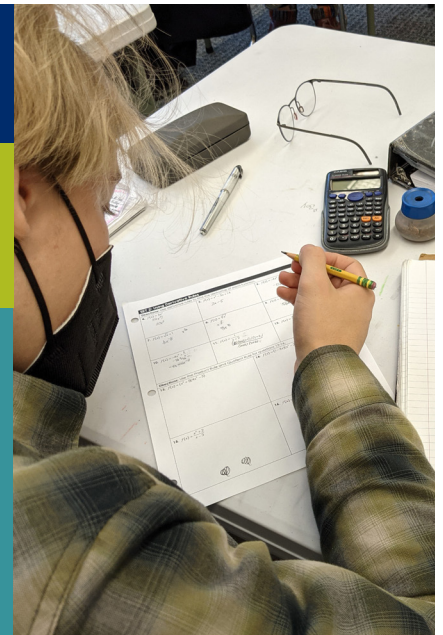
Over the past five years, our students have matriculated at over **70** different public and private universities and colleges in the **US, Canada, Asia and Europe.**

Our students frequently receive **merit-based scholarships** to both public and private colleges and universities at which they will matriculate.

The **strength and breadth of our curriculum** shows in the fields of work and study our graduates choose. Some opt for a gap year to further broaden their horizons or save for college and some may move directly into a job, skilled-trade or business pursuits. When continuing their education, our graduates' choices of college majors reflect a broad scope of interests. On average, **40%** have chosen majors in the Arts or Humanities, **35%** plan to focus on Math or Science, and **25%** will study Business, Communications or International Relations. Whether they are pursuing dance or chemical engineering, interior design or biology, they are **confident learners** who know what they want for the future.
