# Our Graduates are *Engaged with the World* and ready for College and Work

### Internships

During the *spring of their junior year*, our students take part in a wide range of *internships* in businesses, non-profits and the arts. They use these experiences to explore their interests and make practical use of the skills and knowledge base they have gained at our school. Many go on to directly apply this knowledge in future jobs, gap-year experiences or college studies.

### Athletics

Our students are very involved and highly successful in *Sports*.

On average **65%** of our students compete in sports and have carried the Steiner Storm teams to multiple district and conference championships.



### International Exchange

Thanks to our stellar *international programs*, a large portion of our students have unique cultural and language-learning experiences. Many of our local students participate in our robust exchange program, visiting a variety of countries and in turn welcoming students from around the world for a portion of the school year. We also offer *International Student Hosting* for students who wish to live in Ann Arbor exclusively to attend our school for one or more years. They take advantage of our outstanding education and help enliven our community.

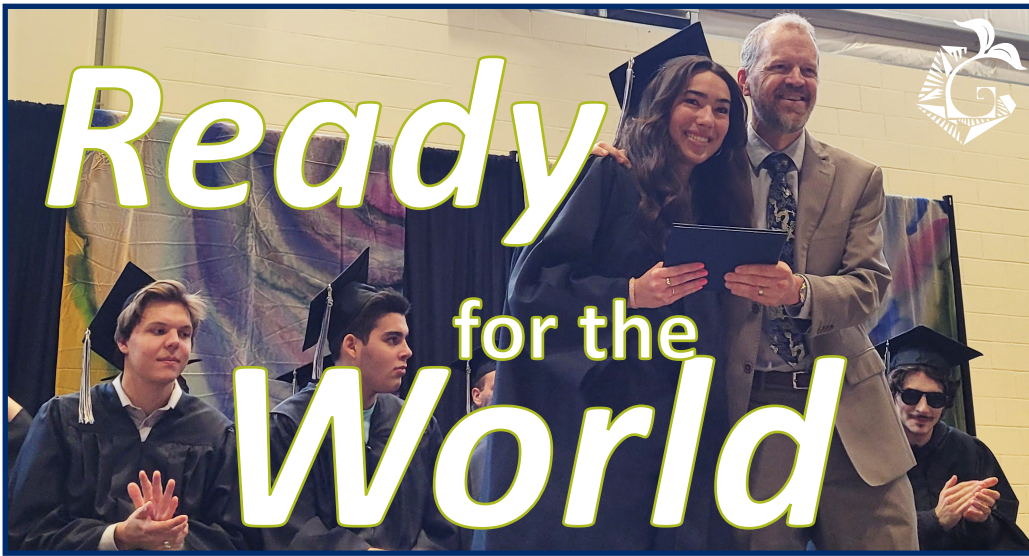

### Trips & More...

The senior year is highlighted by spring and fall trips, a *senior project* and *the senior play*. In the fall, the class studies tide-pool zoology in *Hermit Island, Maine*. Mid-year, the students embark on an in-depth project, diving deep into a technical, scientific, business or creative topic they are interested in. During April, the class spends *two weeks in Italy* studying the *history, art, and architecture* of *Rome, Venice* and *Florence*. Finally, the year is capped off by the senior performance of a *Shakespeare play*.







**The strength and breadth of our curriculum** shows in the fields of work and study our graduates choose. Some opt for a gap year to further broaden their horizons or save for college and some may move directly into a job, skilled-trade or business pursuits. When continuing their education, our graduates' choices of college majors reflect a broad scope of interests.

**On average:**  
**40%** have chosen majors in the **Arts or Humanities**,  
**35%** plan to focus on **Math or Science**, and  
**25%** will study **Business, Communications or International Relations**.

Whether they are pursuing dance or chemical engineering, interior design or biology, they are confident learners who know what they want for the future.

**Over the past five years,**

Our students have matriculated to/been accepted to over **70 different** public and private universities and colleges in the US, Canada, Asia and Europe.

Our students frequently receive **merit-based** scholarships to both public and private colleges and universities.

**The average yearly award is \$20,000.**

Four-year, **merit-based scholarships** awarded to graduating classes average **\$1,200,000.**
